

RECOMMENDATIONS

With strength in interpersonal skills as well as with intellectual bent, Anshoo, you are drawn to careers that allow you to use your empathetic skills, demonstrating practicality and creativity ensuring your independence. Generally quiet and reserved, you are great at communicating your thoughts very clearly, especially in a small group setting and particularly in Writing. You seek intellectual variety and work that is repetitive and mechanical.

You are drawn to fields that allow you to care for people especially one-on-one and allow you to do things in your own creative manner. Given your strengths, Anshoo, Psychology, Human Resources, Teaching and many areas within Media are very suited to you.

Your love for writing can be leveraged in a variety of areas. Besides the obvious career as an Author, other areas such as Features Writing, Content Development and Languages (where you could be involved in translation work) could leverage this well. Writing is an integral part of a career in Psychology as well. Psychologists write detailed case notes and academic papers- Some also publish self-help books. Teaching as an Academic would also involve lot of publishing original papers and research.

A Psychologist can work in the fields of Child Psychology, Industrial Psychology or Clinical Psychology. Criminal Psychology and Sports Psychology are also upcoming, though currently small, fields in India. A highly academic career, the best courses in Psychology are available at the M. Phil. level when you choose your specialisation. Most Psychologists go on to do a Ph. D in their chosen fields.

A good option for you would be to take up Psychology at the undergraduate level. This will allow you to explore whether you want to pursue this career further and take on several more years of study in this field. Public Relations, Market Research, Marketing Analytics or any other corporate career like Human Resources (also extremely suitable though not short listed by you) can be pursued by doing an MBA at any stage of your career. In fact, Industrial Psychology is a very good basis on which to build a career in Human Resources esp. Training and Development.

Alternately, you could go on the take up a Mass Communication course at post-graduate level, where areas like feature writing, content development and editing would be suited and fulfilling- providing the right mix of variety, people focus, creativity and flexibility. The most reputed Mass Comm. courses in India are available at the post graduate level and will allow you to study all fields within Media for a year before you have to choose a specialization between Advertising, Journalism, Editing, Film Making and Public Relations.

Another option to pursue is to take up a subject you enjoy studying, such as English or an interesting Liberal Arts combination, at undergraduate level and then consider a postgraduate in either Media or Management. Teaching will always



remain open to you, Anshoo, after developing requisite expertise and experience in your specialization. A B.Ed. or a post graduate Diploma in Special Education is open after graduation. You could even choose to Teach Psychology or Art or Writing – the possibilities are as varied as you desire, but this is a decision you can take at a later stage in your life. Several of these fields can be explored during school, college and initial work years before you decide on what to focus on during your postgraduate work.

Recommended Subjects

While there are no subject restrictions for the careers you have shortlisted, Anshoo, some suggested combinations will allow to explore your interests further. Keeping English, History and French would build on your existing comfort areas, making it possible for you to do well at them. Psychology at a later stage in school would give you a chance to explore your interests further, as this is also a good foundation for Media, Human Resources, Marketing as well as Social Work careers. Both Business Studies and Economics are good options to give you a flavor of Management careers as well.
